# Newsletter: Week 8 The value we are thinking about this half-term is: LOVE



#### Ash Class

Look at how busy we've been and how we've grown this week!



This week in Ash Class we have started our 'Let's explore' topic. In RE we have introduced the idea of a special baby arrival for Christmas.In maths, we carried out practical

activities to explore one more and one less. We had a lot of fun!

#### Elm Class

Elm Class compared different fable stories, and discovered the moral lesson behind them. In maths, we learnt about units of measurements, and worked out the perimeter of shapes. In PSHE we learnt about the negative effects of smoking.

#### Beech Class

Beech Class has adopted an elephant to support endangered animals! In RE, we discussed Angel Gabriel's importance in the story of the Nativity. In English, we practiced rhyming words, and in maths we continued to look at addition

using part whole model.

#### Field Maple Class

This week, Year 5 have started looking at our new topic in history and science. They have really enjoyed learning some key dates in the history of Ancient Egypt, and learning about different types of forces on an object. We have also created a 'wisdom' wall for RE.



#### **Chestnut Class**

Chestnut Class have learnt that recipes are examples of instructional writing and can identify the features in our non-fiction English topic. In maths, we have learnt 10 more and 10 less, as well as adding and subtracting 10s. In PE, we created our penguin dance.

#### **Grey Willow Class**

Grey Willow Class learnt about recounts in English, and completed operations/mental calculations in maths. We also discussed how different countries celebrate the Day of the Dead, and created colourful artwork related to it.

## Thought for the week

C He said therefore, 'What is the kingdom of God like? And to what should I compare it? It is like a mustard seed that someone took and sowed in the garden; it grew and became a tree, and the birds of the air made nests in its branches.' And again he said, 'To what should I compare the kingdom of God? It is like yeast that a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour until all of it was leavened.'- Luke 13:18-21.

#### Something to think about

Mustard seeds are pretty small. Yeast is tiny.

A mustard seed seems so insignificant but can become a nine-foot high, mustard plant. Yeast seems so insignificant but think about how important it is as you eat your sandwiches.

Jesus didn't come as a mighty warrior with a mass army. He came as a baby, born into a poor rural community.

Jesus didn't build huge buildings and establish mass marketing plans.

He left the vital good news message in the hands of a few terrified disciples, many of whom had dubious backgrounds.

The kingdom is like mustard seeds and yeast. God is often at work in what the world sees as unimportant and the insignificant. However, God's kingdom is expanding and growing all around us. It just depends what kind of lens we are looking through.

It is easy to feel small and insignificant. But then just remember this parable and remember that you have a role to play for the king and the kingdom.


