

### Ash Class

This week we concluded our RE topic on why is Christmas special to Christians. The children were given opportunities to role-play with Jesus in the manger. Vocabulary used: shepherds, angel, joy, peace, good news, Christian, Christmas, gift.

### Elm Class

Elm Class explored ideas and planned their DT project, made Christingles and discussed the significance of each element. The children also practised football skills, explored types of physical activities and their benefits, planned and wrote a letter to Santa.

#### Beech Class

In English, we started to read a new story called Harvey Slumfenburger's Christmas Present. It was so fun because were guessing what Father Christmas brought for Harvey. In maths, we started to do subtraction. In RE, we looked at why the wisemen gave baby Jesus presents.

### **Field Maple Class**

This week Field Maple children have enjoyed going on their school trip to the Science Museum where we looked at interesting artefacts from Earth and Space and enjoyed an exhibition of Music in Science. We have enjoyed making Christingles and discussing their meaning.

### Something to think about

The power of faith can be hugely underestimated. Many studies have shown that those with faith or those who have spiritual practices in their lives receive physical and mental benefit from it.

In the encounter between the Canaanite woman and Jesus, there is distress, anxiety and judgement. Even the disciples want the woman to leave Jesus alone, and they ask Jesus to send her away because of her shouting at them. But Jesus knows he was sent for such a situation as this,

and he has time and healing not just for her daughter, but for her. Her faith led her to Jesus, her faith kept her chasing after him, and her faith in his ability to do something about her situation led to a solution. Jesus praises her for her faith and grants her wish that her daughter might be set free from her burden.

Faith has a place in our lives and in our world, because faith, hope and love are powerful things. The Canaanite woman found this to be true, but that was because she had faith in the right thing – faith in Jesus and in his power.

### Something to do

So often we find Jesus in the places we least expect or imagine. If you had all the faith in the world, where would it lead you? Maybe you can find the courage today to do something new for God.

### Something to pray

God of grace and love, you sent your only Son, Jesus Christ, into the world that we might have perfect freedom. Give me the faith I need today, to follow you and do your will.
